 Manna UDPDATE: Many families are taking advantage of the added convenience of sending gift cards home in folders. Making it a part of your regular weekly spending on groceries and take-out seems to be paying off for people. We will trial it for a few more weeks. Sign this <u>Waiver</u> and sign up on <u>shopwithscrip</u> if you are interested in having your orders sent home with your child. • A few questions have come up related to timeline and payout. In an effort to simplify the program, this year we moved to one annual payout. To explain more on why, this year, we reviewed the process and looked for areas to add convenience but also areas to simplify and reduce cost so that any added value goes directly to the school and families. You can expect your individual payout each August reflected on your "Book Day" tuition bill. Related, about May 15th, you will see a fundraising fee in FACTS if you have not reached the \$300 school earnings requirement (\$300 minus what you've earned for the school thru the program). Remember, the \$175 fundraising fee that was normally charged at the start of the year was eliminated to give families an opportunity to reduce the fee as much as they can. The deadline to accrue towards the \$300 requirement is April 30th. Thank you all for your participation! It's making a difference.



A note regarding Spring Break and our missing work policy.

I hope this note finds you well. I am sure that you are all feeling the excitement of the upcoming Spring Break providing a hiatus from work and school and anticipating the newfound energy that the warm weather brings!

This week we have learned that there are many families who are taking their Spring Break the week before St. John Fisher's Spring Break. Requests have been made to receive missing work ahead of the student's absence. In regard to vacations, the SJF Handbook states: Parents/guardians who take their child(ren) out of school for vacation may not request that teachers make special or individual assignments before the vacation begins. Class assignments, homework and tests will be made up (at home) after the student returns to class. In the absence of formal assignments from your child(ren)'s teacher, reviewing math facts, sight words and reading a good book are great ways to review while away.

If this year has taught us anything, it has taught us to prioritize our family, loved ones and life! We hope everyone enjoys the much deserved and needed time away and we appreciate your flexibility and understanding of our homework and missing work policy.
