#### Important Announcements

- As a reminder, next Monday November 23<sup>rd</sup> and Tuesday November 24<sup>th</sup> have been changed to remote learning days. Students should not come to school for in-person learning on those days.

We understand that parents may be taking advantage of logging into the conference from work. However, if it is feasible, junior high students should attend the conference.

- **Technology Update**: As of right now, we have not received our shipment of Chromebooks that was intended for grades 3 and 4. Like everything else, getting these devices is taking much longer than expected as everything is coming from China. We hope to receive them by January. We did receive our IPad shipment. Eventually, our K-2 students will have access to those while learning from home. For remote learning in the near future, we plan to have our 3rd and 4th graders utilize the IPads. Once we receive the Chromebooks, we will make sure our K-2 students are 1:1 with IPads for remote learning purposes. #### **COVID Reminders**

- The Archdiocese announced that all *Catholic elementary schools will be remote learning from January 6*<sup>th</sup> through January 15<sup>th</sup> with a return to in-person learning on January 19<sup>th</sup>. Please see the details of this important announcement linked here.
- Masks: <u>Please make sure your child's mask fits appropriately</u>. Masks must fit snug and cover his/her nose and mouth. Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe!
- Thank you for being so communicative to the office and faculty regarding your child's absence. Please be mindful that if/when you e-mail a teacher or the office during the day regarding your child's make-up work, we may not be able to respond to you until the end of the school day. We will happily respond as soon as we are able. Thank you for your patience!
- If a student or student's immediate family member is awaiting a test result from the lab AFTER YOU RECEIVED THE RESULTS FROM A RAPID TEST, <u>the student(s) must remain</u> <u>home until the lab results are returned and confirmed</u>.
- Quarantined Cohorts: Please be aware that <u>there is a process that we go through in</u> <u>order to quarantine a classroom</u>. This process includes communication and direction from the Archdiocese as well as the CDC and IDPH and can take several hours to complete. When we become aware of a positive COVID case in our community <u>we act</u> <u>as quickly and communicate as promptly as we are able</u>. We are so grateful for your patience and understanding.

- The Archdiocese has enacted a new policy that *if a family knowingly sends their child* to school when they are positive for COVID-19, the family will be subject to our remote learning option for the remainder of the school year.
- As a reminder, here are answers to some of our most frequently asked questions:
  - If a student becomes ill at school and has 1 or more <u>COVID symptoms</u>, the student and his/her siblings will be sent home. The School Office will send an e-mail to parents communicating that in order for their family to return back to school, parents must share documentation of a negative COVID test result or a doctor's note indicating that the diagnosis is not COVID related.
  - When a student is absent due to an illness, the School Office will e-mail the parents:
    - If the symptom(s) persists for more than 24 hours, the School Office will send an e-mail to parents communicating that in order for their family to return back to school, parents must share documentation of a negative COVID test result or a doctor's note indicating that the diagnosis is not COVID related.
    - Homework cannot be sent home with neighbors or friends, but CAN BE SENT HOME WITH SIBLINGS. Please connect with your students' teacher(s) to coordinate missing work.
    - When picking up your child early from school for whatever reason, parents are expected to wait outside the main office doors.

- If your child's classroom has to quarantine, you only need to quarantine his/her siblings if he/she is showing symptoms of COVID-19. In an effort to keep everyone safe and protect our school community at large, *please communicate with us any documentation you receive from your doctor regarding your child's symptoms/illness*. In order to keep everyone safe, we must always make cautious decisions with the wellbeing of those around us at heart. Thank you for working with us!
- Please partner with us and keep your children safe while outside of school. If we all follow this guidance, we will have a greater chance of keeping our doors open. While your child is not in school, please remind him/her to wear a mask, keep his/her distance, wash and sanitize his/her hands, and stay home if he/she is sick.
- This year you need to reserve your spot for Extended Day Care. Due to the new Covid Safety Guidance, we can only serve 50 students at a time. Here is the form to reserve your spot.


